
PCC OTC Upgrade Scheduled for November 4th Conversion

The Release 5.2 update for the ELVIS website (pccotc.gov) will occur on November 4th. During the conversion, the system will be unavailable from 6:30am ET to 4:15pm ET on November 4th. An email message will be sent to all Agencies once the conversion is complete. All Agencies will then be able to access ELVIS Release 5.2. Your POS computer will not require any changes at this time. What's New for ELVIS?

Windows Tiff Viewer

Release 5.2 is a relatively minor upgrade which includes some behind the scenes patches and enhancements. The one major change is the way that images are viewed. Downloading the JRE.exe file will no longer be required to view images. Release 5.2 will use the Windows® tiff viewer instead of View One Pro, which is used in today's ELVIS environment. Displayed below is an example of how the new viewer looks:



What's New for POS?

The POS Release 5.2 software will be ready for distribution shortly after the ELVIS 5.2 conversion. The conversion to the POS software will be a controlled rollout. Expect more detailed information on the POS conversion within the next couple of weeks or you can contact the PCC OTC representative for your Agency to discuss a specific implementation date. Release 5.2 for the POS also contains many behind-the-scenes patches and enhancements.

If you have version 3.5 to 4.2 of the POS software on your computer, you will be unable to upgrade directly to Release 5.2. You must first upgrade to Release 5.0, which will then enable you to upgrade to 5.2. This will allow you to keep all of your data, and you will not need to uninstall the earlier version from your computer. New Panini Scanners Available

Panini My Vision scanners are now available for use with the POS. These scanners are high capacity duplex batch scanners that have the capability to scan 60 documents per minute, yet single checks can still be scanned. The document feed pocket can hold up to 100 documents of varying lengths. It connects to computers using USB2 interface. This scanner is recommended for Agencies who process 200 or more checks per day. It is very easy to use. Simply place 100 documents or less into the feeder. Both sides of the checks are scanned in one pass. After all check images are captured, the data entry for those items takes place.
